INVISIBLE SON, by Kim Johnson. (Random House Books for Young Readers, \$18.99.) In Johnson's new novel, a Black teenager wrongly accused of committing a robbery tries to step back into his old life upon his release, only to find a world changed by both Covid-19 shutdowns and the disappearance of his friend — a mystery that may be tied to his own struggles.



THE KING IS DEAD, by Benjamin Dean. (Little, Brown Books for Young Readers, \$18.99.) The mixed-race heir to the British throne must confront the disappearance of his secret lover and the sabotage that seems to be coming from somewhere in his inner circle, all while preparing to take up the crown after the sudden death of his father.

ALL THAT'S LEFT TO SAY, by Emery Lord. (Bloomsbury YA, \$19.99.) Lord's new novel follows a grief-stricken teenager who goes undercover at a ritzy private school to figure out the truth behind her cousin's tragic drug overdose, but her investigation grows complicated.

THE LEGACIES, by Jessica Goodman. (Razorbill, \$18.99.) Goodman's latest thriller is about a group of teenagers nominated to join the ranks of an elite New York City society. Instead of a gilded walk, though, they get a journey filled with secrets and murder.

...Also Out Now

ONLY A VOICE: Essays, by George Scialabba. (Verso, \$29.95.) The celebrated critic and essayist surveys the work of the "antimodernist left" — skeptics of how science and notions of progress are shaping our world — including Edward Said and Wendell Berry.

BROTHERS AND SISTERS: The Allman Brothers Band and the Inside Story of the Album That Defined the '70s, by Alan Paul. (St. Martin's, \$32.) While focusing on their eponymous best-selling album, Paul's second book on the Allman Brothers presents a broader cultural history of the 1970s and a look at the highs and lows that led to the band's dissolution.



IN DEFENSE OF LOVE: An Argument, by Ron Rosenbaum. (Doubleday, \$27.) "Love is in trouble," contends Rosenbaum. He plumbs his personal relationships while taking aim at pop psychology, pornography, Marxism and more to defend the inscrutable nature of love.

THE SEA ELEPHANTS, by Shastrei Akella. (Flatiron, \$28.99.) After the sudden deaths of his twin sisters, Shagun flees his imposing and homophobic father, joining a traveling theater group where he finally finds space for grief, self-examination and love.

A quick read and venturesome-filled story of a man who was once at the peak of his prime but found himself spiraling all the way down to the bottom.

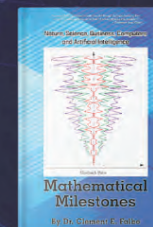


—Kennar Tawnee Chasny—

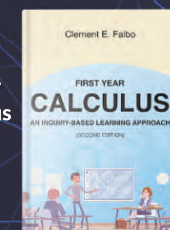

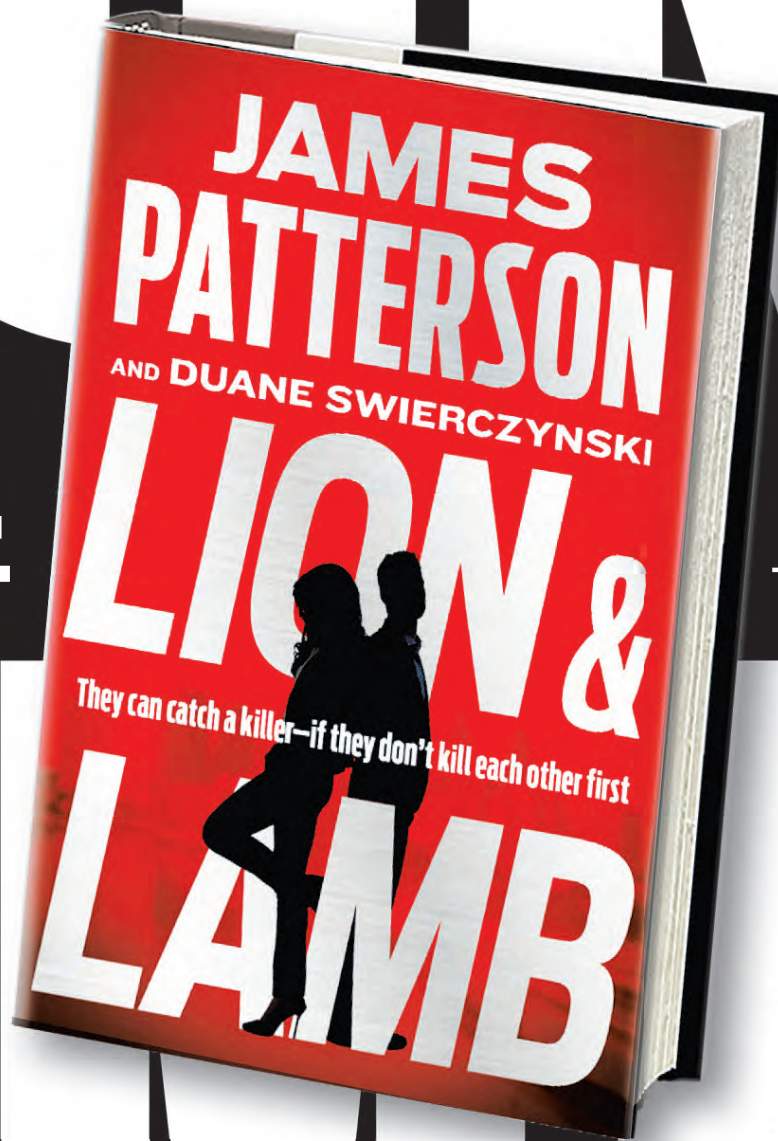


—DR. CLEMENT FALBO—
